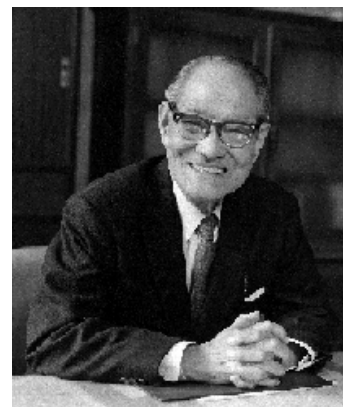

5. Principle of Ichikawa Gakuen

Never stop learning; learn independently and actively!

Yonekichi Koga, the founder, was very much impressed by the educational systems and guiding principles of public schools in the UK, which aim to educate each student and to enhance his or her abilities. These principles have influenced the educational philosophy of our school which endeavors to promote autonomous learning and independence in each student through what we call "the Third Education." While "the First Education" comes from the family at home and "the Second Education" from teachers at school, "the Third Education" is carried out by the students themselves. Among the three, we emphasize "the Third Education" as the most important element for students to focus on.

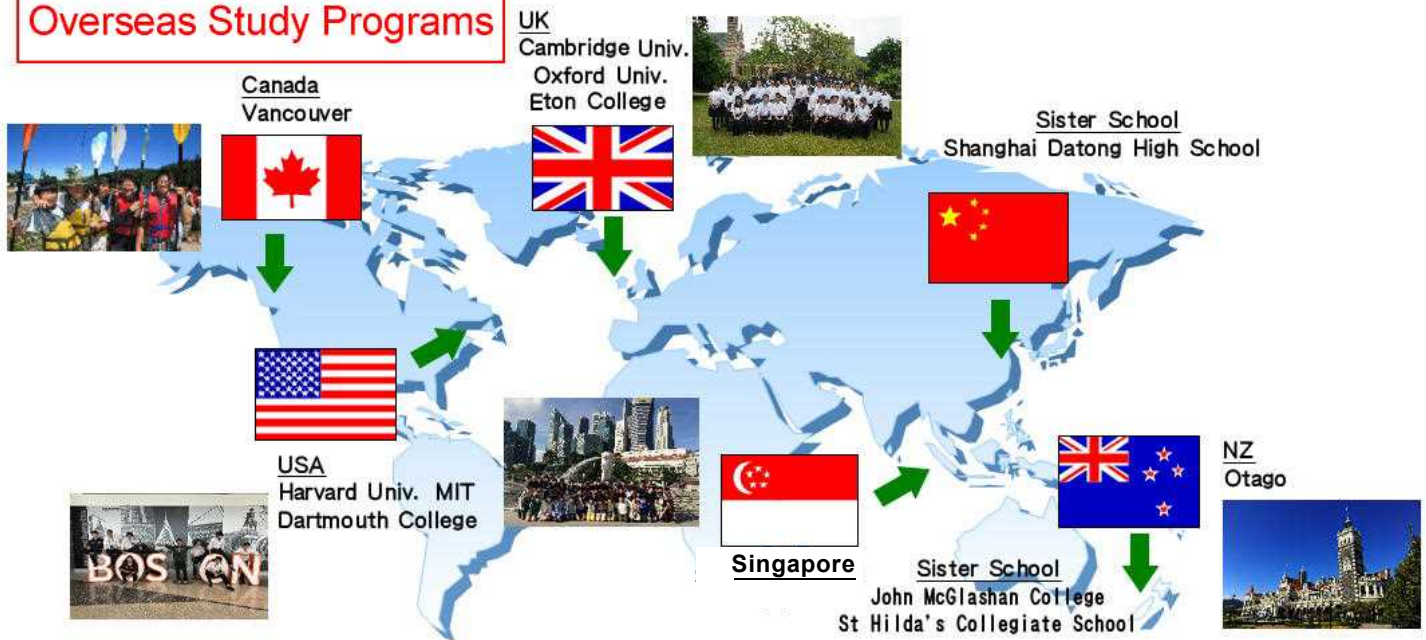

Also, several global programs are held at our school.

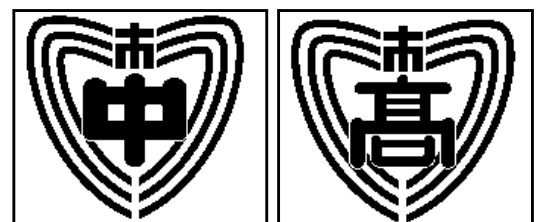
12. UNESCO Associated School
